students design, experience and reflect the entire process of a research project independently (Huber, 2009).

# 1. Definition of the problem



• Example for a research topic: "The illustration of violence in modern music and its influences on teenager relationships"

### 2. Substantiated choice of method

- Consideration of different methods: e.g. interview, discussion
- Example for a research method: Group discussion (Kühn & Koschel, 2011) -> Learning about personal opinions, needs and motivations of the participating teenagers

# 3. Access to the field and implementation

 Assisted by faculty members students get in contact with teachers and social workers at schools to find participants

# 4. Interpretation of the results

- Transcription and evaluation of the discussion, e.g. depthhermeneutical method (Leithäuser & Volmerg, 1988) and creation of a research report
- Reflection: Social relevance of the findings/prospect
- Results may help to improve counseling & new preventive programs
